BOW BRICKHILL CLUB

It is with regret that I have to announce that the meeting on April 1st will see the winding up of the club.

In 1999 I was a member of the parish council and chairman (Norman Causer) stated that several people in the village told him how much they missed the friendly company of the successful 'Tuesday Club' that closed some time ago. It was suggested that a similar club be founded and I agreed to do this on a once a month basis.

At the initial meeting in October 1998 nine people attended. The feeling of the meeting was that one of our aims should be to keep our minds active with talks, quizzes, chats and light refreshments. The first meeting in November was well attended and Jack Bromfield gave a talk on "My life in Bomber Command". This was the first of many varied and interesting talks and in the following thirteen and a half years that followed we only had to pay a fee to two speakers.

In the present economic climate many similar clubs would find that they cannot afford to invite speakers. We were fortunate that our speakers were delighted to receive a small bouquet or a bottle of wine as a token of our appreciation. As ever, things changed over the years. Now there are more activities for the elderly, many members have passed on, others have moved into retirement homes or gone to live with their children. At one time our membership peaked at forty five and we also organised an annual summer outing and a Christmas lunch at different venues. In February this year, only thirteen members attended and it seemed rather embarrassing for the guest speaker to address so few. This prompted one member to say that the time had come to dissolve our club and so on March 4th, the seventeen members present voted with a majority of one to dissolve the Bow Brickhill Club.

I would like to thank the Parish Council for allowing us to use the Pavilion rent free, David Hopkins and the Milton Keynes Council for occasional grants, our Auditor, Brenda Richardson, Jo and her team from the Breakfast Club, the Parish Newsletter, our committee and, of course, our members. I thank you all most sincerely.

Would like to invite the whole village to Bow Brickhill Church Hall on **30th April at 8:00pm** to discuss **YOUR** Church Halls future needs.

These are the facts of the matter and we need to act quickly:

- * The toilets and kitchen are inadequate for the 21st Century
- * The kitchen could be dramatically improved to meet all user needs
- * The storing of chairs and tables outside in sheds is not safe and fit for purpose
- * The flat roof is rotten, so are the doors and barge boards etc.
- * The back steps are really unsafe
- * The support wall beneath the floor has collapsed
- * We are experiencing some structural failing on the west gable
- * Wiring and lighting is inadequate
- * The outside play areas for our children could be improved
- * The stage may be surplus to requirement and takes valuable circulation space.
- * Perhaps we need a small office/meeting room for the vicar/police/storing building admin etc.
- * The cloakroom area is inadequate and insecure
- * Some would like a small sitting out area facing the sun in summer (drop in)
- * The building needs painting
- * Some windows are rotten and do not open
- * The insulation is generally inadequate and the building is expensive to heat
- * The front veranda is rotting fast and showing signs of collapse

So there is a lot to discuss. As a start point ASTRA Community Projects has already commissioned an engineering survey to be conducted by **Simon Bennett** of Alan Baxter Engineering Specialists of London), Simon is a member of the church and lives in Great Brickhill. I would like to take this opportunity of thanking Simon for his generosity in giving his time and expertise free of cost – thank you Simon.

It is hoped our building technician and designer will be present at the meeting to articulate your ideas into a workable plan.

Why not come along and help us create a worthwhile solution that benefits the village for the next half century.

ASTRA's aim will then be to make this happen just as we have done with the saving of the Church Tower.

Working together to improve the A421

Construction work begins to dual the A421

Partnership working could drive further improvements

Following a successful bid for £8.81m of government funding aimed at easing congestion at ‘bottleneck’ areas including the A421 and Kingston roundabout, work has started by Milton Keynes Council to clear the areas around the A421 from Fen Farm to Eagle Farm roundabouts ahead of this busy stretch of road being widened into a dual carriageway.

The site clearance work will take place outside of peak hour traffic to minimise delays. Main construction work is expected to run from July 2014 to mid-2015. The site clearance taking place now will help to protect wildlife, particularly birds before they start nesting.

At the same time, the Kingston roundabout will also be improved by enlarging a signalised junction and widening stop lines to accommodate three lanes. Work is expected to start in April 2014.

The schemes will cost around £17m in total and the remainder of the funding will come from developer contributions.

Cllr David Hopkins, ward member for Danesborough said: “I’m delighted that the work is now starting on site to improve the A421. It’s a busy road and dualling the highway will make a real difference to local congestion. Hopefully we’ll receive further funding to make additional improvements as Milton Keynes continues to grow.”

Bill the Postman - Bill says he is missing us all! By April, he will have been to the hospital for his pre-operation checks and will hopefully have been given a date for his hip replacement.

Before moving on to proposing a full repair and fundraising programme we want to hear from you, the villagers. We want to have your views on what sort of improvements you would like to see.

Beware! - Financial Scams

Thames Valley Police is reminding residents to remain vigilant and not become a victim of fraud. There have been recent incidents of courier fraud in Milton Keynes. The way it works is that people receive telephone calls from a person purporting to come from the Metropolitan Police Fraud Squad. They are advised that staff at their local bank are being investigated. The victim is asked to assist with enquiries and asked to attend their branch the next day, withdraw cash, place in a box or bag which will be collected by a courier for fingerprinting.

Another version of this fraud is that the victim receives a phone call from fraudsters who say they are from their bank or the police and are calling because there has been suspicious activity on the victim's account. They advise them to call the bank from the number on the back of their card. The victim disconnects the phone and dials their bank or police, however the fraudster has kept the telephone line open so even though a number is dialled the victim is still on the phone to the fraudster, who then gains their trust, asks them to either say or key in their pin and tells them their card will be collected and a replacement delivered.

The fraudsters who carry out this type of crime are very skilled in acting the role of bank employees or police detectives. They make the scam seem genuine.

Beware! - Financial Scams

There are lots of different variations to what is essentially the same scam:

- Fraudsters call the customer pretending to be from the police or a bank and ask them to transfer funds via online banking. Again, they ask the customer to call their bank but keep the line open.
- Fraudsters pretending to be from the police cold-call members of the public and tell them that their bank account has been compromised by criminals. The fraudster suggests that the person should transfer their bank balance into a 'safe' police bank account.
- Fraudsters pretending to be from the police attend people's addresses and retrieve the person's card and PIN.
- Letters arrive from the bank on headed paper informing the victim their account has been the subject of a fraud. The letter advises them to transfer their funds to a 'safe' account and that an official will be in contact to provide them with a new card and PIN.
- Fraudsters contact victims and request them to cut their cards in half because their account has been compromised. They are then asked to post the cut card to an address where fraudsters simply tape the card together again and use the victim's details to commit fraud.
- The fraudsters who carry out this type of crime are very skilled in acting the role of bank employees or police detectives. They make the scam seem genuine.
