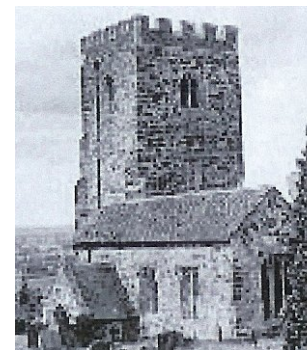

Our speakers last month were Mr and Mrs Nobbs from the RSPB whose enthusiasm for the Society and birds in general infected us all. Mr Nobbs began by explaining a little about the work of the Society which, as well as maintaining the many reserves throughout the UK covering an area roughly the size of Bedfordshire, also includes supporting work in other areas of the world, for example saving the Albatross, the Vultures in India and the Sumatran rainforest. He followed with slides of the top ten garden birds, based on the results of the 'Big Garden Birdwatch' and to the surprise of many of us who have not seen them in our gardens for several years, the House Sparrow is No.1 and the Starling No.2. Mr Nobbs was warmly thanked by Carol Stewart for providing such an informative and entertaining evening and the competition for an electrical item for an eighth wedding anniversary was won by Pam Schorr in the form of a 'frog' clock!



Three new members were warmly welcomed at the AGM in November at which Pat Pullinger was once again unanimously re-elected as President and the current committee voted in en bloc to support her. A brief outline of next year's programme was given which highlighted much to look forward to in 2008, starting with the topic of "From Amateur to Professional Photographer" at our January meeting. Prior to the AGM formalities, members enjoyed a fish 'n chip supper followed by birthday cakes to celebrate both Ann's and Sally's birthdays this month.

CHRISTMAS FLOWERS AND CLEANING

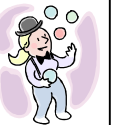

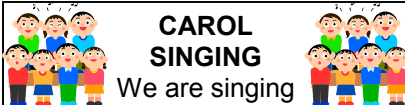

We can all find it hard to be patient, and there are times when waiting is very hard, especially when we are dreading something rather than looking forward to it, or when we find it hard to have hope.

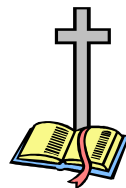
But waiting with anticipation, and looking forward with hope, can be an important part of the most special occasions, and the greatest celebrations.

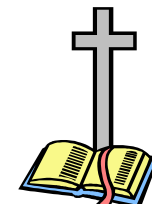
