PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

Project "champions" wanted

Economic times may be hard, but there's still money to be had for improving local areas, if you are quick enough off the mark in applying. Whenever the Parish Council meet, we seem to have a long list of ideas but no money and no detailed plans. So, we are looking for project "champions" in the village who would be prepared to take an idea and develop it, with costings, so that it is ready to submit should a funding opportunity become available. We would like a "big" (up to £250,000) medium (up to £50,000) and small (up to £10,000) projects.

The first step is to compile a list of ideas, which we've already begun to do in the hope that the Blind Pond Farm planning application might go ahead, and we'd receive some money in the form of "planning gain." The current list is as follows:

- 1. Extension to pavilion (though this is probably not top of our list, as it would increase the running costs).
- 2. Major refurbishment of pavilion with the aim of improving income and reducing both running costs and our impact on the environment e.g. solar panels/heat exchanger/insulation/boiler upgrade.
- 3. Minor enhancements to pavilion e.g. storage facilities, improvements to the car park.
- 4. Additional play equipment although we think the play area is quite good already.
- 5. Provision of a "skate" area for the older children or other facilities for teenagers.
- 6. Provision of a community village shop, though as this would be a continuing commitment, just getting capital funding for it would only be the start. We would also need to identify premises and be sure that it could survive, given the close proximity of shops in Woburn Sands.
- 7. Providing additional landscaping and planting.
- 8. Improvements to village street lamps to be more 'rural'.

Do you have other ideas to add to the list? Would you be prepared to take one of these ideas, or one of your own, and develop a detailed, costed plan suitable for a funding bid? If so, please contact James Byles (16 Downs View) e-mail james.a.byles@accenture.com.



NEW CONTACT DETAILS FOR THAMES VALLEY POLICE

Thames Valley Police has gone live today (14/11) with 101, the new national single non-emergency number, which will replace the 0845 8 505 505 number.

Both numbers will run side-by-side until the end of March, but if demand for the 0845 8 505 505 number drops it may be discontinued earlier.

Calls to 101 (from both landlines and mobile networks) cost 15 pence per call, no matter what time of day the call is made, or the duration of the call.

Everyone calling the police for non-emergency matters will now know exactly how much a call will cost them, and can be assured of equal access whether they are on a pay-as-you-go mobile or a home land-line.

The routeing will be based on the same system as 999 calls which links a caller's dialing code to the police force that covers that geographic area. Calls from a landline will be routed to the nearest police force that covers the area's dialling code. If the caller is using a mobile, the call will be routed using the location of the mast that the phone is transmitting from.

If a call is made to 101 within a force area that has not yet `gone live', the caller will hear a recorded message telling them to redial using the relevant non-emergency number.
