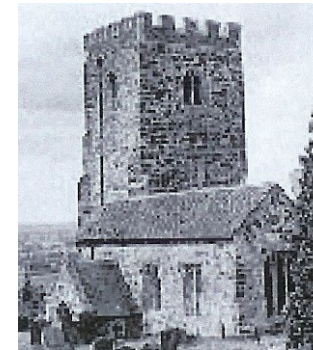

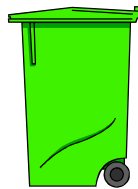
Saturday 15 July: Normal Saturday service plus an additional train departing Bedford at 23.10 (11.10pm) after the firework display for stations to Bletchley.

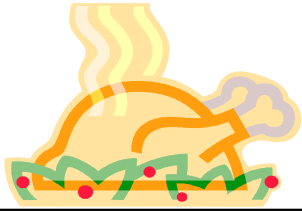

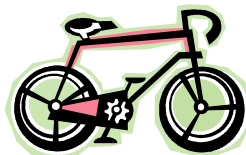

Hoping that we shall have fine weather and a very enjoyable day out.

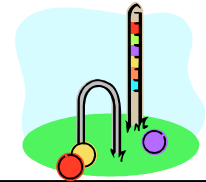
Following that, our August meeting will be a games afternoon.

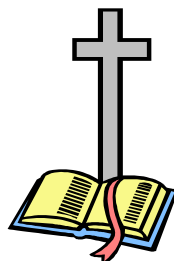

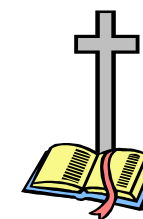
