The reply received from an email sent to the Citizen about the nondelivery of the newspaper to parts of Bow Brickhill

Dear Mrs Sidgwick

Thank you for your recent communication regarding delivery of the Milton Keynes Citizen .

As a result of a recent review of our delivery and carbon footprint a decision has been made to reduce the number of copies of the MK Citizen delivered in some areas of Milton Keynes and surrounding villages. Unfortunately this means we are currently unable to deliver a copy to you.

I should point out that the MK Citizen is produced by Johnston Press which has suffered as a result of the economic downturn, particularly in terms of soaring costs of newspaper print and distribution costs. I should also point out that advertising revenue is our only source of revenue and this too has declined. The newspaper is not sponsored in any way either by independent businesses or the council, consequently some difficult decisions have been dictated by tough trading conditions, including those of distribution which have to be limited.

We understand your disappointment but alternatives have been made available by way of increasing availability at additional outlets and online at <a href="https://www.miltonkeynes.co.uk">www.miltonkeynes.co.uk</a>

I hope this goes some way to explaining the situation which is always under constant review.

#### The De Havilland DH108 air crash

In 1950 a de Havilland DH108 experimental jet aircraft crashed here killing the pilot, Stuart Muller-Rowland. The VW120 was involved in transonic dive research and the test flight was supposed to examine the effects of change from sub-sonic to transonic flight, but the aircraft is thought to have broken up whilst in a dive. Some of the wreckage came down at Little Brickhill, the cockpit somewhere near Bow Brickhill church and other pieces were found as far away as Husborne Crawley. Muller-Rowland's body was found near Sandy Lane between Bow Brickhill and Woburn Lane. A new book has been published about the three DH108 prototypes and the men who flew them - A Very British Sound Barrier - DH108: A Story of Courage, Triumph and Tragedy
