### Still a Blessing

Dear friends,

Sometimes a verse or passage from the Bible will attract our attention, and speak powerfully to our lives and circumstances. I had one of these experiences recently, as I listened to an Old Testament reading during one of our services. The section that stood out for me was this:

This is what the Lord says:

'As when juice is still found in a cluster of grapes and people say, "Don't destroy it, there is still a blessing in it," so will I do on behalf of my servants.

(Isaiah 65. 7)

The setting is one of the assurances that God will not abandon his people. Despite their disobedience and lack of faith, and all the trials they have been through, they are assured that God will fulfil his promises. The image is either of grapes that have already been pressed once, and appear to be used up, but which still have some juice in them, or perhaps of grapes that appear shrivelled and dry, but which have some goodness within.

At a time when we as a family have experienced illness and other setbacks, and I am aware of others locally who are going through difficult times, this verse brought me back to God's promise that, even at times when we feel that everything is hopeless or negative, God is with us, and will work for good with us, if we are ready to work with God.

The promise is that, even when we find it hard to have hope, *there is still a blessing in it* for us and our loved ones.

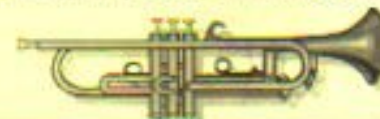

## AFC Brickhill Rangers End of Season Report

The highlight of the last year was the setting up of our junior side. The training sessions commenced last summer and the encouraging turn out enabled us to form teams at both Under 10 and Under 11 levels. More than 20 local youngsters are now regularly involved and the matches attract a healthy number of parents, friends and supporters from the village. Our sponsors have provided a new kit and the teams will join structured leagues next season after playing a series of friendlies over the past few months. The committee is extremely proud of the junior section of the club and will continue to aid their development as much as possible. The number of junior players continues to grow and anyone wishing to join in should contact the junior team Manager, Greg Hayes – boys and girls of all ages are welcome.

The club also ran a very successful charity match and barbeque last summer which raised £300 for Helen & Douglas House, a charity involved in caring for terminally ill children. This was a cause backed by one of our senior players who had special motivation in helping this charity. We would like to say thank you to those villagers who attended the barbeque and contributed to the overall donation.

Looking back over our last season, it is easy to forget how far we have come in our two short years at Bow Brickhill playing fields. When we first applied to hire the village pitch, it was overgrown and untended, but thanks to our generous sponsors, Hasmead and P R Lowe Butchers, we have been able to improve the playing surface no end, although there is still work to do. The financial implications of paying rent to the parish council and also funding the maintenance of the field are considerable for an amateur club and we are very grateful for the help we have received.

The incredibly wet winter that we have just endured highlighted an existing problem with the drainage and although we carried out some work to remedy this last summer, the problem is still occurring and we would hope to improve the situation further over the coming months. We lost many games to waterlogging and this resulted in a fixture pile up in the latter weeks of the season. At one stage the senior side faced 18 games in 42 days.

On the pitch, our senior team competed strongly in the Intermediate Division of the North Bucks League. The club did not quite reach the promotion places in the league (finishing 4<sup>th</sup>), but did reach the final of the league cup, unfortunately losing out in the final. The club also reached the quarter finals (from 264 teams entered) of the Junior County Cup and this marked the furthest round the club had reached in its short history. The squad struggled without a full time manager for most of the season and this contributed to a rather flat end to the league campaign when fixture congestion took a heavy toll on players and ultimately, results.

The Committee are very pleased with the compliments we have been paid by the league regarding the running of our club. We received a glowing reference from the NBDFL when we first approached the Parish Council and this season we were held up as an example to the rest of the league as to how an amateur club should be run and this is obviously very humbling. We have also received compliments from visiting referees and opposition regarding our conduct and this is another great source of satisfaction. In the 2005/6 season we were awarded the 'Fair Play' award by the Berks & Bucks County Football Association. We shall continue to try and maintain these high standards.

We would also like to thank the Wheatshaf for the hospitality they have shown us, both after matches and during our committee meetings over the past year. We also enjoyed a very enjoyable 'Race Night' at the pub and this generated over £600 to club funds. A big thank you to the patrons who contributed to the race night and to the regular football cards we ran after matches. Your support is greatly appreciated.

We would again like to thank everyone who has wandered down to offer their support over the season and hope that we see you again. Anyone wishing to get involved with the club should contact the club representatives listed below, the senior team are still looking for a manager, and 'off the pitch' help is always welcome for both teams, as are new players.
