

#### Did you know?

In 1920 the parish clerk wrote to Newport Pagnell Urban Council asking if a War Memorial could be erected on the village green. Permission was duly granted and the Memorial was erected in 1921 with the Parish Council agreeing to undertake its care and upkeep. In 1968 it was knocked down by an unknown culprit. A house to house collection raised the £45 needed to cover its repair.
