World War 1



The Bow Brickhill History Society thought it appropriate to acknowledge the start of WW1, which ultimately has had an influence on all our lives.

Led by Gill Cannell, the group have been researching life in Bow Brickhill at that time. Much of the information has come from transcriptions from local newspapers but we are also using information from the Parish Council Minutes and what is known locally about the men mentioned on the War Memorial. With help from a grant from Milton Keynes Heritage Association, a booklet is being published and will be available to coincide with the anniversary of the declaration of war in August 1914.

It would be wonderful to have a pictorial record of those years. If anyone has photographs of the village, local people, the fallen men mentioned on the War Memorial, or indeed any family history from this period, and would be willing to have them published, please contact Gill, email candishtowers@gmail.com, tel. 373602.

We have researched what a tea at that time would consist of and this will be served, interspersed with accounts of local life, and contemporary poetry and prose, read by various members of our community.

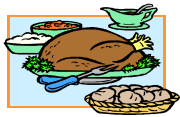

Closure of Woburn Sands Police Station

The decision to close Woburn Sands police office was made a few years ago in line with the Asset Management Plan of the time. It is a relatively expensive unit which only housed one or two members of staff and a volunteer front counter provision. In between times, other officers have temporarily moved into the building pending the opening of a facility in Broughton Fire Station which is nearing completion. The aim is to move these officers out during this coming financial year. The LPA will now need to consider how to retain a presence in the community through effective engagement, appropriate tasking and Have Your Say activity. Woburn Sands will still have a neighbourhood team.

Online vehicle fraud is costing the nation a road-rage inducing **£17.8 million** each year, according to new figures released by Get Safe Online and the National Fraud Intelligence Bureau (NFIB) today. This is the equivalent to 89 Aston Martin Vanquishes.

Fraudsters used the following methods to steal their victims' cash:

- Part or full payment for the vehicles and then loss of contact with the "seller" accounted for nearly half (**49%**) of frauds
- More than a third (**37%**) of cases involved the payment of a deposit rather than the full amount
- Bank transfers (**58%**), fake eBay Invoices (**14%**) and fake Google Payment Systems Invoices (**12%**) offering non-existent "buyer protection" for the transaction were the most commonly cited payment methods
- Some victims paid funds to holding accounts on the basis that funds will be held until the buyer has received the goods and is satisfied with them. Other victims received texts from well-known websites requesting refundable fees for car inspections
