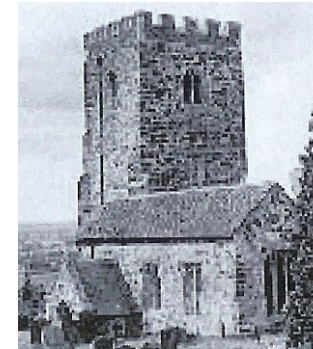

Tickets are priced at £10, £15 and £20 and concessions are available for children and students priced at £8. Balcony seating is also available.

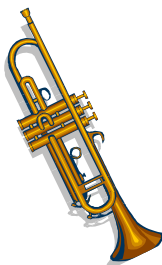
Two concessionary tickets for the motor disabled are priced at £8 and disabled access to the Guildhall is available.

## ALL SAINTS CHURCH

Every five years our church is given an inspection by an architect. His report goes to the PCC and the Diocese. Previously concern has been expressed over the erosion of the masonry on the tower buttresses and in some parts of the tower itself. The latest report recommends that repairs be carried out within the next five years. A guide price of £63,000 has been obtained from a stonemason. This is a guide price and not an estimate or quote. If this project proceeds it is possible that grant money may be available to cover perhaps 2/3rds of the cost leaving approximately £20,000 to be raised locally.

The Parochial Church Council cannot carry out this project alone so we invite interested parishioners to form a committee, separate from the PCC but reporting to it, to:

Investigate the feasibility of the project  
Obtain at least 3 quotations for the work  
Investigate the possibility of obtaining grants  
Fundraise, apply for grant funding and to oversee the project in conjunction with our architect

The present church building has been in the village for 600 years and doing this work now may ensure it remains part of the village heritage for future generations.

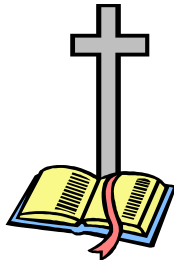
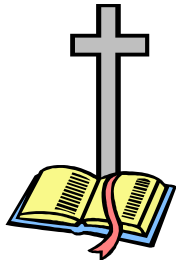
