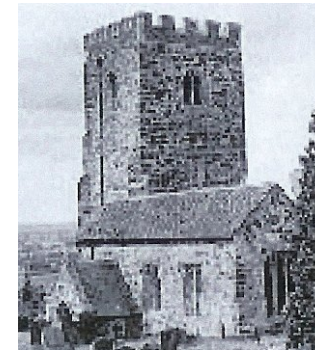

Our speaker for this month was Rachel from 'Rosie Bubbles' (the name inspired by pink Champagne), on the topic of hats. With the help of a fascinating slide presentation, she explained how she hit her pre-30 crisis in a financially rewarding but unfulfilling job and decided to follow a childhood ambition to make hats. She led us through the history of hats from a primitive form of protection from the weather, via 18th century fashion depicted by the Duchess of Devonshire's 'picture hat' through to more modern times with the now very popular 'fascinator'. She concluded with hints and tips on what type of hat to wear, especially for the vertically challenged among us, and the opportunity to try on some of the gorgeous hats she had brought along to illustrate her talk.

WHEELCHAIR ACCESS TO THE CHURCH HALL

The Parochial Church Council are pleased to announce the construction of this project after many months of planning. The PCC obtained a 90% grant from WREN Ltd (Waste Recycling Environmental) Community Fund. This fund is available for community projects and is linked to rebates from landfill tax. The wheelchair access was identified in the Parish Plan as a project to enable the church hall to be accessible to all. The PCC hope that the community find this new access an asset to the village.

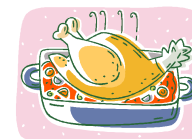
EASTER CHURCH FLOWERS AND CLEANING

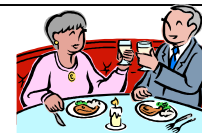

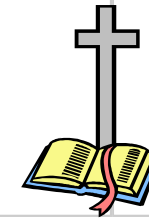

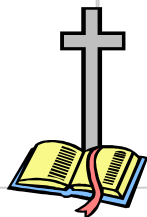
