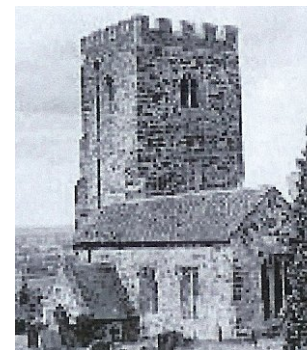

Playground

A working group is being set up to progress plans for new play equipment to meet the needs of older children. This will include a representative from the School and the After School club and it is hoped that Children might also take some part in the planning.

Football

At its last meeting The Parish Council received a report from AFC Brickhill Rangers. The Parish Council were particularly encouraged to hear that the junior football team is attended mainly by children from the village. The junior side is growing and doing well and is hoping to take two sides into the junior league. Their kit has been sponsored by local business and the support from parents has enabled the team to also run social events which are held in the village pub. The junior team are also aiming for standard chartered status, a professional recognition run by MKC and the Football Association.

Water-logging of the pitch continues to be a problem and has prevented a number of games from being played at home. This is despite a lot of work already done by Brickhill Rangers to try and improve drainage. Further, more drastic work, is proposed to try and rectify the problem.

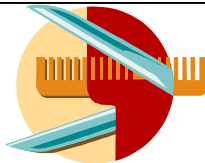
Another three current players have been sent on ECB level 2 coaching courses with the help of our sponsors.

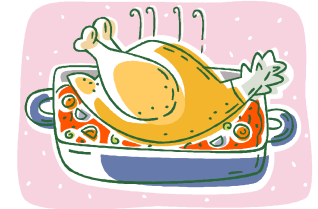

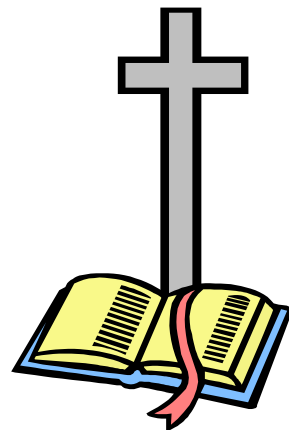

Rector's letter

Amazing Grace

Dear friends,

March 27th this year is the 200th anniversary of the abolition of the slave trade by the British Parliament. This was a significant step towards ending what has been described as 'one of the most brutal chapters in human history.' In one way this could be seen as a part of history that is passed and gone, but there is much in it that is still relevant to our lives and our world today.

Along with others, many committed Christians played a major part in the campaign against slavery, including William Wilberforce, and John Newton – who is best known today for writing the words of Amazing Grace, a celebration of the freedom we can find in God's forgiveness and love. John Newton was once the captain of a slave ship, but, after his conversion to the Christian faith, he became a key figure in the anti-slavery movement, and a clergyman who served at one time as Vicar of Olney.

Our Lent courses this year will look into the history of the trans-Atlantic slave trade and its abolition, as well as exploring relevant passages from the Bible, and so seek to learn lessons for the life of our world today, and the struggle against slavery which is far from over. The course is called Set All Free. Please contact me for details of the days and times of our various group meetings.

What John Newton came to understand is that there is a paradox at the heart of the Christian faith, which is that we gain our true freedom by being ready to give it up, as we offer ourselves to the service of God in Jesus Christ. For Jesus said:

Those who try to gain their own life will lose it; but those who lose their life for my sake will gain it. (Matthew 10. 39)
