### TREES AT THE TOP OF CHURCH ROAD

Mary Preen has had a long and informative conversation with the contractor felling Beech trees at the top of Church Road and here's her report.



All of the Beech trees are infected with Honey Fungus therefore must be felled. Some of the wood is still classed as White Beech and will go for furniture making etc. The infected and redder wood is considered to be second grade. All the upper branches are being burnt to try and contain the infection. It's very sad but all the trees at the top end of the Stone Ground, Church Road on the Wood Lodge side will be removed including the ones very close to the road. However the area will be replanted with hard woods in March.

The work is being undertaken by a contractor on behalf of the Bedford Estates who had to obtain a licence from The Forestry Commission to do the felling. But there are no more tress scheduled to be removed this season in our part of the woods. Last year's oak trees, some of which are still lying on the side of the main drive leading to Sandy Lane are sold on site and are gradually being called off and taken to the mills.

The number painted onto the felled trunk refers to that individual tree and also enables the estate to settle their account, as the contractor is paid by cubic tonnage and not the number of trees felled. Other markings are: Red Spot – condemned tree, White Spot – denotes the edge of an area, Metal Tag with Number – means the tree has been inspected and a record is held at the estate office.

### Hannah Holden strikes Gold for Duke of Edinburgh

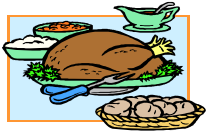

Hannah is now helping bronze and silver participants with their expeditions and training.

### SWAN CREDIT UNION



Credit unions are not-for-profit financial co-operatives. They offer similar services to banks including savings accounts, loans and a range of other services to help their members to save and manage their money responsibly but they differ from banks and other financial institutions in that they are owned and democratically controlled by their members, serve people not profit, contribute to the local community and invest funds ethically.

The Swan Credit Union (formerly known as Milton Keynes Credit Union) is based in Wolverton and is run for the benefit of its members who live and/or work in Milton Keynes, North Bucks or the Thame area.

It operates three local branches in Milton Keynes, Aylesbury and Thame. ### ASTRA 500 Club draw



We are fully expecting that works on the church tower, directed and funded by the ASTRA project, will be completed this Spring.

Over the last three years we have carried out much work to restore the inner fabric of the tower, replace stonework and re-point the external faces of the tower, deep clean the church, improve pathways in the churchyard to make access to the church so much easier (which has also made the approach to the church more attractive), and thanks to the willingness of His Grace The Duke of Bedford to hand over part of his estate to the Parish for this purpose we have extended the graveyard.

All this has been accomplished in three years. We have raised some £85,000 during this period in terms of donations, grants and costs of material equipment.

The ASTRA 500 Club itself has contributed £2,000 towards the conservation work. This is a great tribute to all concerned, those within the village community, many of whom had put in many hours hands-on work to achieve these results, and to enthusiastic supporters far beyond.

It seems the right time now, with the end of major works in sight, to hand over operation of the ASTRA 500 Club to the Parochial Church Council, the parent body of the ASTRA subcommittee. Proceeds raised from the 500 Club will continue to be directed to maintaining the structure of this important church building.

Medieval buildings require much on-going funding to keep them physically sound and insured, and All Saints Bow Brickhill is no exception. We need to bank a few thousand pounds a year to preserve this outstanding building.

As from February 2014 Andrea Spurdle takes over as administrator of the 500 Club. Her address is 42a Station Road, Bow Brickhill, Milton Keynes, MK17 9JW, (email [andrea\\_spurdle@earthling.net](mailto:andrea_spurdle@earthling.net)).
