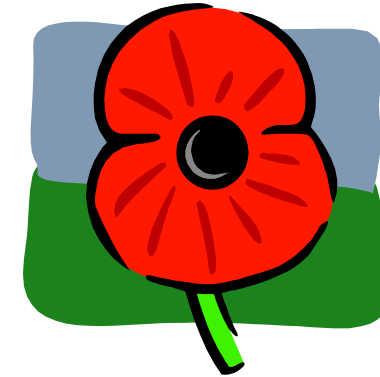

GERALD FEATHERSTONE KNIGHT MC

This gentleman has been a bit of a mystery - his name appears on our war memorial but now a book he wrote has appeared on an American web site. You can download it free from <http://www.archive.org/details/brotherboschairm00knigrich>. It tells the tale of Gerald, grandson of Rev Knight Vicar of Bow Brickhill, who became a Flying Officer in the Royal Flying Corps in 1916. He was captured in Germany, held for nine months, escaped and made his way back to the UK. Gerald was admitted to hospital in June 1919 and died from cancer in October 1919, aged 25. Six weeks after his death the London Gazette reported that "in recognition of his gallantry in escaping from captivity whilst a Prisoner of War" the King had awarded Gerald the Military Cross.

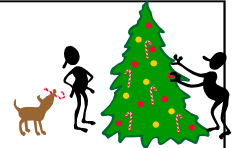

After studying agriculture at university, there was little chance of funding a traditional farming career and so he decided to try his hand at bee-keeping and now runs a very successful business. Income streams include not only the sale of honey, both in bulk and home bottled, but also breeding queen bees for sale and transporting hives of bees to other parts of the country to aid pollination in apple and plum orchards. His speciality honeys, including stem ginger and heather, sold well during the course of the evening which concluded with refreshments and a quiz entitled "Oranges or Apples", for example is Elison's orange an apple or.....?
