All Saints Tower Restoration Appeal



State of Play

The end is in sight after two years of hard work and enormous support from the village and 'Friends'. Final work on the tower takes place in early summer 2013 with completion by the end of July. ASTRA finances are such that we can repay generous loans made to cover funding shortfalls while we battled to recover the VAT. There are more fundraising events to come including a grand Golf Day at Woburn Golf Club. His Grace The Duke of Bedford has given the go-ahead for an ASTRA fundraising invitation golf tournament on 18th May next year.

Next year's work

New stonework will be inserted in the west window. The buttresses will receive no more than half a dozen new stones to complete the light touch renovations and the mid-tower level stringcourse will be renewed. Then the tower will be in grand shape but to improve access in 2013 paths to the church will be improved to provide a safer route. Discussions are also in progress with Bedford Estates to enable a small extension to the churchyard.

Lawrence Anthony, a legend in South Africa and author of 3 books including the bestseller **The Elephant Whisperer**, bravely rescued wildlife and rehabilitated elephants all over the globe from human atrocities, including the courageous rescue of Baghdad Zoo animals during US invasion in 2003.

On March 7, 2012 Lawrence Anthony died

He is remembered and missed by his wife, 2 sons, 2 grandsons and numerous elephants. Two days after his passing, the wild elephants showed up at his home led by two large matriarchs. Separate wild herds arrived in droves to say goodbye to their beloved man-friend. **A total of 31 elephants had patiently walked over 12 miles to get to his South African House.** Witnessing this spectacle, humans were obviously in awe not only because of the supreme intelligence and precise timing that these elephants sensed about Lawrence's passing, but also because of the profound memory and emotion the beloved animals evoked in such an organized way: Walking slowly for days - making their way in a solemn one-by-one queue from their habitat to his house. Lawrence's wife, Françoise, was especially touched, knowing that the elephants had not been to his house prior to that day for well over 3 years! Yet they knew where they were going. The elephants obviously wanted to pay their deep respects, honouring their friend who'd saved their lives - so much respect that **they stayed for 2 days and 2 nights without eating anything..Then one morning, they left, making their long journey back home.**

Pierre Giraud, Chair of Milton Keynes Astronomy Society, and several colleagues brought their telescopes and cameras to the Church Hall, where Pierre gave a most interesting talk on the night sky; the universe; comets and the solar system. This was followed by a delicious selection of curries provided by Simon from the Wheatsheaf and some of the Astrological Society members showed stunning photographs of the galaxies and constellations taken by their special cameras. Unfortunately, the weather conditions made it impossible to view the sky through telescopes from the church tower as had originally been planned, although it is hoped to be able to offer this opportunity when conditions improve. As the darker evenings draw in, burglars are on the prowl for valuables and cash.

If you leave your home in complete darkness and your curtains are not drawn, and no car is on the drive, it's an obvious sign to an opportunist burglar that no-one is in. At this time of the year more than any other it pays to secure your home.

There are a number of simple ways to do this, all of which will help reduce the chance of your home becoming the next target.

- Visit a local retailer to pick up a 24 hour segment timer for under £5. The timer can be used with a lamp, radio or TV to give the impression that someone's home. Remember to use an energy efficient light bulb
- Register your valuables on www.immobilise.com its free and takes just a few minutes and if your valuables are stolen, will allow you to tell the police, your insurer, and the second-hand trade to assist in recovering your property and catch the thief
- Keep valuables out of sight
- Lock your doors and windows, if you have a UPVC door make sure you have double locked it
- If you have an unexpected visitor and don't know who it is don't answer the door!

PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

Sewage smells in Church Road

Residents in Church Road have continued to suffer from extremely unpleasant sewage smells over the past few months. Cllr Phil Thomas has taken this up and, after going through all the complaints procedures at Anglian Water, has finally been permitted to lodge a complaint with the Consumer Council for Water. As a result, Anglian Water have had two meetings with Woburn Estates/ Woburn Golf Club and Phil Thomas had a further meeting with the Golf Club early in October. The Club is prepared to fund a technical survey of the sewage system by Anglian Water to try to ensure that all problems are rectified. In the meantime, any recurrence of the smells should be reported to **Anglian Water on 08457 145145**, informing them that the pumping station and dosing unit at the Golf Club need attention.

Obviously, it is not satisfactory that residents should be constantly having to contact Anglian Water in this way and the Consumer Council is being pressed to ensure that AW meet their obligations by finding a permanent solution to the problem.

Pavilion improvements

The Parish Council was delighted to be successful in obtaining £8,000 from MK Council following our bid for Parish Partnership Funding to refurbish the toilets at The Pavilion. We are currently awaiting competitive quotes for the work.



New lighting has been installed in the “kitchen end” of the hall in order to provide a much improved area for those doing craft work, or holding meetings.

We are currently planning to bid for funds for a new kitchen, and in the meantime have ordered an over-due replacement for the existing cooker.

Police and Crime Commissioner Election – 15th November
