UNAUTHORISED EMCAMPMENTS

Following the recent increase in unauthorised encampments across the borough, we thought it would be helpful to make contact with landowners who may be impacted.

If an unauthorised encampment is set up on land owned by you, firstly you need to contact Thames Valley Police and advise the group that they must leave the land immediately. An example of a notice is available. Please be cautious and have full regard for your own or your employees' health and safety as required by law.

During office hours, an officer of MKC can take this step on behalf of your business on the proviso that it is agreed that MKC staff costs are covered at a rate of £58.22 + VAT p/h and the attached signed notice is passed to us for service. If you wish to use this service, please contact:

RUITNorth@Milton-keynes.gov.uk 01908 253200

If the group refuses to leave after notice has been given, then you will need to instruct bailiffs directly. We can provide more information to you should this situation occur.

If an unauthorised encampment is set up out of normal office hours on your land, you can contact the council on 01908 226699 and your details will be passed to an officer who will not be able to serve notice out of hours but will ensure that at the beginning of the next working day an officer makes contact with you immediately to provide appropriate support as set out above.

If there are six or more caravans and there has been damage caused, the police may serve notice on the group if there is a significant impact on the local community. Advice will need to be sought from TVP in these circumstances as the decision will need to be taken by a superintendant or above. If the police are to take this course of action, they will need evidence that you have told the group to leave otherwise they cannot act.

Furthermore, all reports of crime should be passed to the police immediately.

"I was just wondering if it would be all right if she carries a golf bag while we walk?"

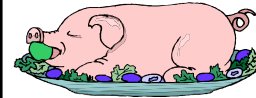

Reparation is a practical way for young people to pay back for the harm caused by the offence completing constructive relevant and useful projects which help and improve the local community.

Former, chief executive of the YJB, said “We believe local communities have good ideas about how to improve youth justice, and young people are less likely to re-offend after participating in reparation schemes”.



Reparation is intended to prevent the Young People continuing to offend by helping them to understand the effects of crime on the victim(s) and how to make

amends. It is a sentence of the court and is supervised by a member of the G4S Reparation Team.
