The exercises, quiz, raffle, and our usual afternoon tea, soon completed a very entertaining afternoon and once again it was time to bring our meeting to a close.

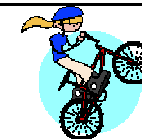

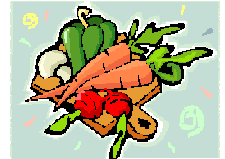


Family Service
