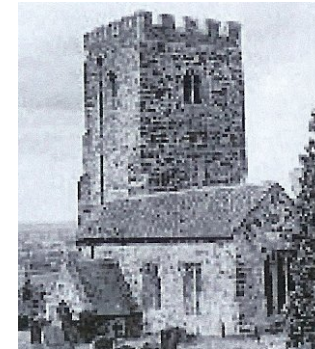

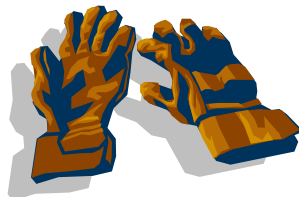

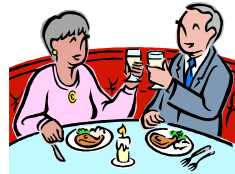


Harvest Supper

Each Christmas All Saints Church make a small profit from Webb Ivory catalogue orders. The Church is now looking for somebody to take on the job of co-ordinating the orders.

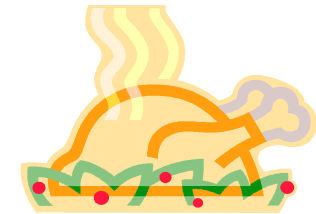
It involves ordering and distributing the catalogues, collecting and submitting the orders, distributing the orders when received from Webb Ivory and collecting the payments.

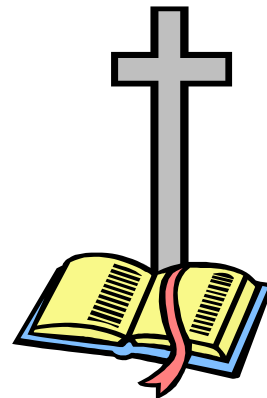

Dear friends,

September can be a time of new beginnings. Children are going back to new classes and teachers, and some are going to new schools.
